How to Vote by Absentee Ballot

- 1** Submit an Absentee Ballot Application to your county election board by the deadline for the upcoming election. You can request an absentee ballot for a single election or all elections for the rest of the year. Submit online, by mail or in person.
- 2** Once you receive your ballot in the mail, fill out your ballot with your selections and place it in the ballot envelope.
- 3** Sign the affidavit and have it notarized. The affidavit envelope needs to be placed in the OUTER envelope provided with the ballot.
- 4** Affix with proper postage (70 cents or two forever stamps) and drop it in the mail in time for the election board to receive it no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day (NOT just postmarked by Election Day).

With current delays in mail service due to COVID-19, make sure to put your ballot in the mail as early as possible, preferably a week before the election date.

AVAILABLE TO ALL VOTERS

Any registered voter can vote by absentee ballot. Oklahoma does not require voters have a reason to request an absentee ballot.
